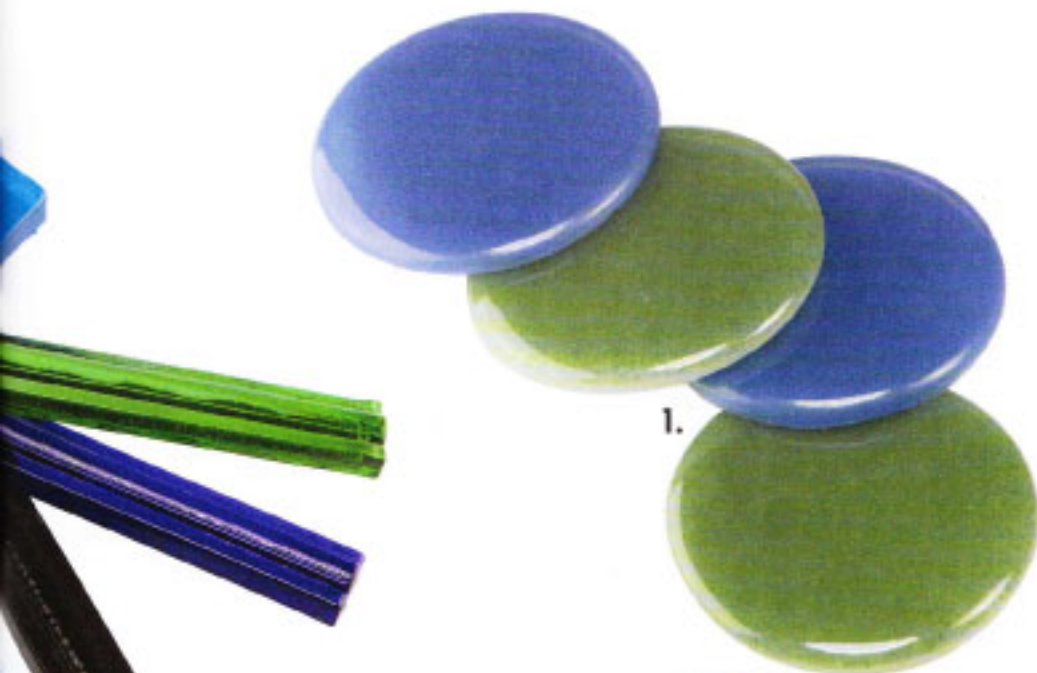

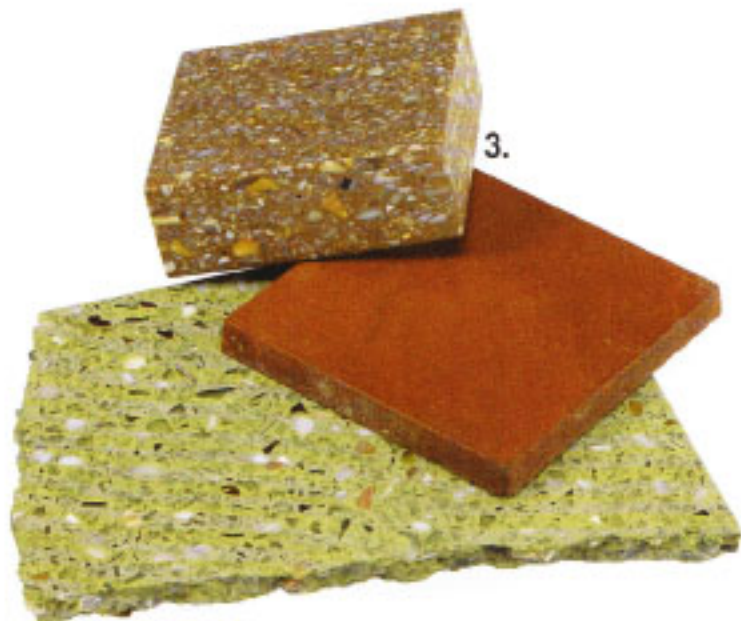

- 2-1/2-inch tile reminiscent of your favorite lollipop! Made from recycled glass by Portland's Stardust Tile, \$48 per square foot. Available at Pratt & Larson (1201 S.E. 3rd Ave., 503-321-9464).
- Ice Stone is made from 100 percent recycled glass in a cement matrix and has Cradle to Cradle certification. \$120 per square foot installed. Available at Pratt & Larson in Portland.
- Fuez turns cement, fly ash, recycled glass and even crushed shells into polished surfaces. \$11 to \$32 per square foot. Available from Fuez (503-289-7000, fuez.com) in Portland.
- Recycled 4-inch by 4-inch aluminum tiles, \$11 each. Made by Eleek (503-232-5526, eleek.com) in Portland.
- Reserve Coco Tiles, \$25 to \$40 per square foot. Available from Surface (1235 S.E. Grand Ave., 503-235-1235) in Portland.
- 100 percent recycled glass 1-inch tiles from Sandhill Glass, \$3 each. Available at Ecohaus (819 S.E. Taylor St., 503-222-3881) in Portland.
- Recycled glass translucent tile with a profiled edge. \$73 per square foot. Available at Ann Sacks (1210 S.E. Grand St., 503-233-0661) in Portland.
- liner tiles, \$8 each, or 4-inch by 4-inch spiral tiles, \$10 each, made from recycled glass by Aurora Glass (auroraglass.org) in Eugene, Ore.
